In 1655 a grant was made to Dean Winthrop & others of eight miles square at a place called Pettapawog for a Plantation to be called Groton. In 1656 leave was given to vary a little from a square In 1659 there were four or five families settled in Groton. In 1668 the survey was completed by Jonathan Danforth. In 1753 Pepperell and Shirley were each set off & incorporated as separate Towns.

In 1830 Groton contained 1925 Inhabitants. — In 1831 it contained 295 Dwelling-Houses — 3 Grist Mills — 4 Saw Mills — 1 Fulling Mill — 1 Starch Factory — 5 Taverns — 5 Stores. It contains 27351 Acres of Land — 500 covered with water — 420 for Roads, being 97½ miles length — Distance from Boston 34 miles.
