Dr. Samuel Abbot Green, 1830-1918:

Doctor, Military Man, Author, Scholar, Archivist, Politician,

Benefactor, Eccentric Bohemian

A list of Dr. Green's publications, pamphlets and printed materials, including hyperlinks to full downloadable and searchable text versions, appear at the end of this compilation. The list has approximately 130 items (with some repetition).

Dr. Green, profiled by the prominent institutions below and whose published materials include local and military history, transcriptions of diaries and gravestones, compilations of business records and ephemera, his own public addresses, works on bibliography, biography, biology, cartography, genealogy, geography, medicine, Native American culture, western religion, witchcraft, the arts, accountings of public records and even maritime piracy, has a singular place in our local history. It is doubtful that any town has as a native son a more prolific or wide-ranging author. His research is thorough; his writing is excellent and remains quite readable today. He also designed the Groton town seal and established the position of "Keeper of the Town Clock" after donating the timepiece now housed in the steeple of the former Baptist Church. Dr. Green owned the house, built for his father, at 154 Main Street

Dr. Samuel Abbott Green's Collection of Groton Broadsides

Born into the esteemed Lawrence Family, son of Eliza (Lawrence) Green and Dr. Joshua Green, Samuel grew up to become a physician, prolific author, and noted historian. A graduate of Lawrence Academy (1847) and Harvard Medical School (1854), he served on many boards, including 52 years as a trustee of Lawrence Academy, the last eight as president. Dr. Green, a surgeon in the Union Army, was elected mayor of Boston and also served as librarian of the Massachusetts Historical Society from 1868 to his death in 1918. During those years, the Society's holdings grew from 8,000 to 50,000 volumes. Considered eccentric by some, Samuel Green proved to be a trustworthy, generous individual, Bohemian in nature, who charmed those he encountered, collecting and recounting intriguing stories of life in Groton.



As a passionate collector, Dr. Green gathered in six volumes a host of Groton area posters, programs, catalogs, and other printed ephemera. Volumes I, III, V and VI have been conserved. Volumes I-V are available for viewing on this website. Volume VI is coming very soon. You may also view or download the [Dr. Samuel A. Green Collection Index](#).

This collection contains medical instruments that belonged to Dr. Samuel Abbott Green and his father, Dr. Joshua Green. Many of the items in this collection were likely used by Dr. Samuel A. Green when he was a surgeon during the civil war. The collection also contains a pair of spectacles from the early 18th century.

Biography

Samuel Abbott Green became Boston's twenty-fifth mayor in 1882. Dr. Green was born in Groton on March 16, 1830. His ancestors came to America in 1636. He was educated at Groton Academy, which later became known as Lawrence Academy, and at Harvard. After four years study abroad in some of the best hospitals he returned to Boston and began the practice of medicine. He became surgeon of the Second Massachusetts Militia Regiment in 1858, and went to the front at the outbreak of the Civil War, where he served with distinction in his chosen profession. He planned the cemetery on Roanoke Island, one of the first cemeteries for soldiers who fell in the war, and had charge of the hospital ship Recruit on the Burnside expedition to Roanoke Island. His official connection with the city of his adoption extends over many years and covers many activities.

From 1860 to 1862 he was a member of the School Board, and again from 1865 to 1872, when he was also superintendent of the Boston Dispensary. From 1868 to 1878 he was trustee of the Boston Public Library, and acting librarian from 1877 to 1878. He was the donor of the Franklin collection of books and engravings now in the Public Library. He was city physician from 1871 to 1882, and in the last part of 1881 was elected mayor as a candidate of the Citizens and Republican parties. During his administration politicians found that it did not pay to lounge in the corridors of City Hall. The Police Commissioners were removed, and receipts from liquor licenses increased by over \$22,000, a great sum for the times. In a paper advocating his reelection, it said: "After ten years as city physician he has probably more intimate knowledge of the poor and a firmer hold on their heartstrings than any man in the community. His home is, and has been for a long period, on Kneeland Street, and there, in the midst of the suffering classes, he has been ever ready to listen to any tale of sorrow or discouragement and any request for counsel or comfort from the lips of the needy."

When the Prince of Wales, later Edward VII of England, visited Boston, he was shown the rooms of the Massachusetts Historical Society, where Dr. Green was at the time librarian. The Prince was interested in John Winthrop's History of New England and George Washington's epaulets. The date of the visit happened to be the anniversary of the surrender of Cornwallis.

Samuel A. Green

Trustee of the Boston Public Library, 1868-1878. Born 1830 in Groton, MA; died 1918. Physician, librarian, politician, author and antiquarian. A graduate of Harvard College in 1851, Samuel Green received his medical degree from Harvard Medical School in 1854 and continued his medical studies in Philadelphia and Europe. The first physician in the state to enter the army medical service, he served in two Massachusetts regiments and in a number of other medical staff positions during the Civil War. Upon his return to Boston, Dr. Green continued his medical practice and found time to also serve as the city physician and mayor of Boston for one term. He assumed the temporary position of "Trustee in Charge" following Justin Winsor's resignation in 1877. Concurrent to his time on the Boston Public Library's Board of Trustees, Dr. Green also was a member of and served as the Librarian of the Massachusetts Historical Society until his death in 1918. Prior to his departure from the Board, he established the Green Trust Fund to acquire books to commemorate Benjamin Franklin and later donated to the Library books from his personal collection that would become the nucleus of the Franklin Library within the Boston Public Library. A native of Groton, Dr. Green wrote several books on the history of that town as well as a family genealogy following his service on the Board.

Biographical Note

Samuel Abbott Green was born in Groton, Massachusetts, on March 16, 1830. His ancestors arrived in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1635 along with two servants. Green devoted his life to the study and practice of medicine. After graduating from Harvard in 1851 and Harvard Medical School in 1854, he began his career as a District Physician for the Boston Dispensary.

When the Civil War broke out, Green enlisted as an assistant surgeon to the First Massachusetts Regiment and was quickly promoted to surgeon of the 24th Regiment. He remained in this position until 1864. During his enlistment, he also ran two hospital ships and acted as chief medical officer at Morris Island, South Carolina, during the siege of Fort Wagner. As such, he was likely one of the last people to speak to Colonel Robert Gould Shaw before his death.

After the war, Green returned to the Boston Dispensary as Superintendent. Later on, he was appointed City Physician of Boston for the years 1871-1883. He ran for mayor of Boston in 1882. Green was also an active member of the Boston School Committee, briefly president of the Boston Public Library, and a trustee of the Franklin Fund. He was especially invested in the study of history and gave much to his memberships at the American Antiquarian Society and the Massachusetts Historical Society. He eventually became librarian and later vice-president of the Massachusetts Historical Society. An avid collector, Green compiled several volumes full of posters, programs, and other ephemera from the Groton area. These items are now held at the Lawrence Academy in Groton, Massachusetts. Green died in Boston on December 5, 1918, the oldest surviving member of the founders of MIT.

Abstract

This collection consists of papers relating to the town of Groton, Mass., collected by Samuel A. Green in preparation for his *Groton Historical Series*. Dating from 1646 to 1909, the records include deeds, indentures, wills, receipts, accounts, warrants, petitions, muster rolls, and other military papers, as well as the military and professional papers of Col. William Lawrence, the military papers of Capt. Thomas Lawrence, and scrapbooks relating to Groton events.

Collection Description

The Groton historical papers consist of 3 document boxes, 1 oversize box, and 3 bound volumes dating from 1646-1909 with the bulk of the material from 1725-1805. Gathered by Dr. Samuel A. Green in preparation for writing his *Groton Historical Series*, the papers include deeds, indentures, wills, receipts, accounts, tax records, warrants, petitions, muster rolls, and correspondence. Prominent names within the collection include the Blood, Flint, Lakin, Lawrence, Prescott, Shattuck, Sawtell, and Tarbell families. Many of the records were created by the offices of the Groton town clerk and justice of the peace and include papers of Justices of the Peace Benjamin Prescott (1696-1738) and William Lawrence (1697-1764).

The papers of Col. William Lawrence are especially prominent within the collection and contain many records relating both to his role as justice of the peace and to his military service. Lawrence began his military service during Dummer's War in 1723, rising to colonel in 1754, and served under General Amherst at Fort Ticonderoga in 1759. Records relating to Lawrence's military career include appointments, promotions, and receipts documenting salaries paid to his soldiers. Many of the deeds included in his papers document Lawrence's land purchases in the Groton area. Records relating to the construction of the Groton meetinghouse, 1751-1761, are included in his papers and consist largely of receipts, account books, and meeting minutes.

Other highlights of the collection include documentation of the early and persistent conflicts with local Native Americans, as evidenced by a 1675 petition to the Massachusetts General Court requesting aid against increasing Native American hostilities. The collection also documents many of the military units raised by the town during both the French and Indian War and the Revolutionary War. Of particular note are the papers relating to the company of Capt. Thomas Lawrence, Ebenezer Nichols's regiment, of the Massachusetts militia in the French and Indian War. They include muster rolls, pay receipts, and inventories of the belongings of soldiers killed in action. Also of note are the military warrants of the South Company of militia, calling for members to attend drills and training.

In addition to his *Groton Historical Series*, Green used his collected documents as sources for his published historical sketches in the *Proceedings of the Massachusetts Historical Society* and in his weekly newspaper column, "Turner's Public Spirit." The collection contains several reprinted documents, with Green's commentary and explanations, as well as pamphlets containing topical historical sketches of Groton.

Three bound scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings, programs, and correspondence. The "Groton, Mass." scrapbook (1874-1892) contains clippings of historical sketches written by Green, especially for his weekly column "Turner's Public Spirit," as well as obituaries, wedding notices, and programs relating to Groton events. The "Bi-Centennial" scrapbook (1855-1888) contains documents relating to the celebration of Groton's 200th anniversary in 1855. The third scrapbook, "Fires at Groton" (1892-1893), contains newspaper clippings relating to two fires which occurred in July 1892 and the litigation that followed.

Arrangement

The bulk of this collection consists of loose documents that were bound into nine volumes in 1908-1909 and disbound in 1976. Documents were numbered in the back lower left corner, indicating the page number and volume in which they were bound. The volumes were originally divided into the following four categories: Miscellaneous, volumes 1, 2, and 9; Col. William Lawrence, volumes 3-6; Military, volume 7; and South Company, volume 8.

These categories have largely been preserved in the collection's present organization. It now consists of the following five series: Groton town papers; Col. William Lawrence papers; Military papers; Samuel A. Green papers; and Bound scrapbooks. Documents previously labeled Miscellaneous are now organized into the Groton town papers series. The documents in the Military and South Company volumes have been brought together in the Military papers series, but the distinctions have been retained with the subseries.

Green's notes relating to documents in each volume, as well as several of his published pamphlets, have been gathered into a separate series.
